### Relationships and Sex Education at Rusper

Dear Parents and Carers.

A little later than promised, here is the detail about Relationships and Sex Education being taught at Rusper this half term. Our teaching focuses on healthy relationships and keeping children safe in the modern world. It also covers a wide range of topics relating to physical and mental health, wellbeing, safeguarding and healthy relationships. Learning about the emotional, social and physical aspects of growing up will give children and young people the information, skills and positive values to have safe, fulfilling relationships and help them take responsibility for their own well-being.

#### In terms of **Relationships** Education the key elements are

- 1. Families and people who care for me
- 2. Caring friendships
- 3. Respectful relationships
- 4. Online relationships
- 5. Being safe

All 'Relationships' elements of the subject are taught through our existing PSHE lessons and are compulsory.

#### In terms of **Sex** Education. There are two key elements to be covered

- 1. Preparing boys and girls for the changes that adolescence brings
- 2. How a baby is conceived and grows (Year 6)

Point 1 is a part of the Primary science curriculum and is also compulsory.

Point 2 is due to be taught later in June. This element is optional and parents still have the right to withdraw pupils from this.

We already have an established approach to teaching RSE at Rusper, and we are intending to teach these RSE units of work before we break up for the summer. For your information, below is our current curriculum map showing key content that will be covered.
