#### Updates

As most of you know, since the 'Lockdown' announcement on 20<sup>th</sup> March, all schools and families have been adapting to vastly different ways of working. RPS is now operating on two fronts. For the vast majority of our pupils, safety is best managed with them remaining at home. For a small number of pupils,

government guidance dictates that schools should remain open. For the last four weeks, RPS staff have been working according to a rota to keep the school open for specific pupils; including during the Easter Break. This staff rota maximises opportunities for staff 'distancing', whilst fulfilling a 'front-line' role.

As it stands, the 'lockdown' is to remain in place until further notice; and thus the school will continue to work in these two ways.

Please rest assured that all parents will be kept up to date re RPS arrangements as things change at a national level.
