Dear Parents and Carers,

I trust this letter finds you and your families well; and your children beginning to ready themselves for the start of the new school year. At RPS we are all well, and ready to continue providing the personalised teaching, care and attention to detail that your children deserve, and that we pride ourselves on

We are about to recommence full time schooling for all children over five years old. Managing Coronavirus remains the highest priority, but our government is now emphatic that all children should must to school to avoid risks to their ongoing development. Attendance is now compulsory for children over 5. For some children this will be the first time back in school since the end of March – five months away! For other children just starting in Reception this will be a significant transition, made more significant due to a lack of nursery provision since March. In acknowledgement of the potential concerns many parents may have about returning their child to school, I would like to begin my first communication of this school year with words of support.

All staff at Rusper Primary are fully aware of the potential impacts of these gaps in school routine on children's academic and emotional development; and how these big transitions could impact on their well being. As we move into September please be reassured that we (all RPS staff) are fully committed to deliver the best possible personalised support for your child. We will be diligent in all elements of health and safety – doing everything possible to reduce risk of virus transfer, and being fully compliant in all training and risk assessing. We will be passionate and thorough in identifying and supporting the specific academic and developmental needs each child may have. We are here for your child and for you.

All parents of school age children across the UK are facing similar situations and there is much general information available from the government. Please see the leaflet attached with this letter, and also all the information and resources for parents found at www.gov.uk/backtoschool

What follows are general updates specific to Rusper Primary and the new academic year...

What Rusper Primary is doing to reduce virus transfer risk

Ensuring all parents are clear on and uphold current government protocols and expectations

- ✓ Do not send your child to school if they have coronavirus or symptoms of coronavirus
- ✓ Do not send your child if they are isolating along with other family members
- ✓ Undertaking a Coronavirus test as soon as symptoms present
- ✓ Engaging with and acting upon Test and Trace information

Being ready to respond to a localised coronavirus outbreak by

- ✓ Working with local Public Health England Reps to consult and agree decision making
- ✓ Specifying whether individuals, groups or whole 'Bubbles' need to close
- ✓ Ensuring Remote Learning platform is ready to maintain learning at home









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Maximising social distancing by:

- ✓ Working in two separate Bubbles. Bubble 1 is YR, Y1 and Y2 and Ms Clarke, Mrs Rodgers, Mrs Russell, Mrs Jones and Mrs Goodenough (providing special support). Bubble 2 is Y3, Y4, Y5 and Y6 and Mrs Comber/Mrs Matthews, Mr Snook, Mrs Lord, Mrs Caplin and Mrs Smallwood (providing special support).
- ✓ Ensuring the Bubbles don't interact or crossover
 - Different entry and exit times. Please see table below. Full detail available in due course on 'Protocols Powerpoint' doc. (note the schedule below applies from 7th Sep to all Year groups except YR – separate transitionary details for 1st two weeks from 7th Sep)

- Separate break times, delivery of lunches and separated use of toilets.
- Specific routes marked through school to avoid crossover
- Central equipment including laptops and hard standing play equipment not shared divided for Bubble use
- Individual stationary sets for Y3 and older
- Distanced desk arrangements for Y3 and older

Ensuring thorough hand hygiene by

- ✓ Trained approaches to hand washing for all
- ✓ **Timetabled handwashing / hand sanitising** eg on entry, after using shared class equipment

Ensuring good respiratory hygiene by

- ✓ Engaging all pupils in Catch IT, Kill It Bin It
- ✓ Ensuring all pupils use tissues, handwashing and lidded bins for waste

Please note, full details on all protocols (where, when, what and how) will be shared with parents via a powerpoint document by 1st September. A fully itemised risk assessment will be published on the school website by 4th September.

What Rusper is doing to recover learning and development

Ensuring pupil well being is prioritised and routine quickly re-established by

- ✓ **Pupils feel in the mind-set for school by wearing school uniform** full and correct school uniform is expected from the outset for every pupil
- ✓ Allocating time for pupils to learn new routines and adjust back to school
- ✓ Emotional support is accessible for any pupil who requires it









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Reintroducing a broader curriculum for all pupils by

- ✓ Ensuring key subjects are covered each week
 - PE physical development and well being (all outside)
 - PSHE well being and understanding
 - Science knowledge and essential skills
 - ICT essential skills
 - Art well being, expression and creativity
 - Spanish (KS2)
 - Learning through play YR, Y1 and Y2
- **✓** Ensuring foundation subjects steer topic focus

Either History, Geography, DT or RE to be a half termly focus, and covered in detail for the duration of focus

Adjusting our approach to maximise core curriculum recovery by

✓ Prioritising language and numeracy development

- All initial language teaching will focus on vocabulary, phonics, reading and core writing skills
- All initial maths teaching will focus on core number recall and key processes
- Foundation subject planning will be focussed on application of core subject skills eg building vocabulary

✓ Ensuring regular thorough assessment is used

- Daily assessments practices (observing, talking, questioning, marking), inform what children need
- Broader assessments (eg written summary assessments for KS2, phonics screen for Y1 and Y2) are used occasionally (only when required to complete assessment profile)
- Ensure that teaching revises previous Yr group objectives if required, including giving Y1 pupils access to EYFS.

Ensuring specific approaches are used for SEN pupils and identified pupils by

- ✓ Using personalised plans and specific strategies for highest needs pupils
- ✓ Ensuring SEN pupils have access to specialist resources available eg Speech and Language
- ✓ Disadvantaged pupils / pupils with larger academic gaps have access to additional tutoring in school

Ensuring that there is remote learning provision available instantly it is required by individuals or groups by

- ✓ Making sure the RPS Teams platform is ready with all pupils assigned to the right classes
- ✓ Making sure work is planned and resources are ready for upload the moment they are require









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The schedule for next two weeks

Tuesday 1st September Governor working party finalises all elements of school risk assessment Power Point of full protocols sent home to parents and published on website

Wednesday 2nd September RPS governors meet to discuss and finalise updated risk assessment for full school return.

Risk Assessment published on website

Thursday 3rd September School closed for INSET with all staff

Friday 4th September 9:00 – 1:30 – School closed for INSET with teachers

1:30 – 3:30 – School open for pupils in YR, Y3, Y4, Y5 and Y6 for a transition session with new teachers. Y1 and Y2 pupils need not attend.

(A separate note will follow shortly for relevant parents)

Monday 7th September Y1 – Y6 pupils attend full time (see schedule above)
YR pupils attend 1:00pm – 3:00pm (a separate not will follow shortly for YR parents)

Tuesday 8th - Friday 11th September as Monday 7th September


Monday 14th - Friday 18th September Y1 - Y6 pupils attend full time (see schedule above)
