A note from our Chair...

Welcome to the Spring Term 2018 edition of the Governor Newsletter. As ever it has been all go at Rusper.

Dave Cole the Link Adviser from West Sussex has been to Rusper already for his termly visit. This term the subject was The Review of Inclusive Practice

which looks at Rusper's provision for children with Special Educational Needs and Disadvantaged Children. I was present for all of the meeting and it was encouraging to see that Dave Cole supports the 'Good' judgement of the school relating to its inclusive provision.

We hope you are all now familiar with our new Vision, Values and Mission Statement. This was the outcome of one of the INSET mornings last September. One of our governors David Warren led the morning and it was great for staff and governors to join together for the morning. It was very successful and we hope that you and your children are embracing the new look Values and Mission Statement. If you haven't seen it already, there is a fantastic display in the foyer which was created collaboratively by pupils, staff and governors. It consists of the five hands which represent our new core values and their new colours: **respect**, **independence**, **curiosity**, **collaboration** and **enthusiasm**.

The main monitoring focus for governors this term will be maths, led by Maths Governor David Warren. There is a whole school focus on Maths fluency (see article below from Mr Snook). Writing, spelling and handwriting are the monitoring focus for our English governor Catherine Pinder, and Wayne Mott will be looking at teaching and learning in science. I am the new SEND governor and will be looking at the quality of SEND provision across the school backed up by the information gleaned from Dave Cole's visit. All governors are assigned to a class and you will see information about each governor in their respective class. We are called Class Friends and are invited into our class to see a particular event or activity. This is not a monitoring visit, it is purely for governors to become involved more in school life and get to know the children in their class.

We would like to say a huge welcome to Rick Hamnett who has become an associate at Rusper. Rick lives in the village and doesn't as yet have children at the school. We are very grateful to Rick and his wife for their help in decorating the foyer area of the school. We had to say goodbye to Simon Young last term as he and his family had to leave Rusper due to his work commitment. Simon wasn't a governor for long but amongst other things he played a very important part in the school's Ofsted visit during the summer term for which we would like to thank him. We currently have two vacancies for a parent governor coming up. MATHS FLUENCY - MR SNOOK

This term all teachers and support staff will be leading the pupils in a new incentive to improve their maths fluency. 'Maths Around the World' will focus on one particular aspect of fluency throughout a half term. It will engage children by using the countries around the world alongside fun, active and purposeful teaching. Each country will represent a small-step target, which will build up to meeting an overall fluency target for that half term. It will specifically focus on children's ability to quickly recall number facts and their times tables.
