Thank you to all EYFS parents who attended the '6 Weeks In' meeting. Mrs Rodgers was pleased to share some key tips for supporting early reading and phonics at home. The powerpoint has been sent to all Gruffalo parents.

In Year 1-6, RPS is developing several key areas of curriculum provision. This year, we will be adding to our collections of high-quality Reading texts, with the aim of deepening pupil engagement in story and character. It is commonly established in education that good teaching of reading helps to improve outcomes in Writing; particularly from the point of view of developing vocabulary. Please do ask your child to tell you about the book they are reading in class; and do ask about your child's writing when you come in to parent meetings.

Another focus for development will be **X Tables**. Our mission is to raise the profile of X Table practice, and improve accurate re-call. To this end we are currently using the **Times Table Rockstars** website. Watch this space for more information.
