Blossom Class - Mrs Green







Firstly, I wanted to start with a huge well done to the Blossom children. This week, I have been assessing the children's phonics knowledge, and they have all made progress. I also wanted to say a thank you to the parents for your continued support with reading and phonics practice at home. This has made an impact on their learning and development.

It snowed! What a fantastic way to introduce the changing seasons and observing the signs of winter. The children were captivated and completely in awe of the snow and had a blast playing in it.

Lastly, we are celebrating being scientists this term, and the children enjoyed this week's science activity of exploring volume and sound.

Willow Class – Miss Jones

This week, the children have been enjoying the wonderful story *So Much!* by Trish Cooke. The book celebrates the joy, warmth, and love found within families, and the children loved joining in with the repeated phrases and lively rhythm of the story.

We spent time talking about the things the children enjoy so much - from playing with friends, visiting grandparents, cuddling pets, to celebrating special occasions at home. The children also shared what makes their own families unique, and how different families show love and care in lots of special ways.

Our discussions linked beautifully to our learning around celebrations and the importance of family. The children reflected on how family is where we feel safe, valued, and loved, and how celebrations bring everyone together to make happy memories.

Maple Class - Mr Snook

This week in Maple Class, focusing on **complements to 100** (pairs of numbers that add up to exactly 100, such as 45 + 55). Fast-paced games are proven to improve recall speed and mathematical fluency, which are essential skills. To help support this at home, we encourage you to spend just a few minutes each day playing one of these quick games. They can be played easily anywhere, even during car journeys! Two simple examples are:

- 'To 100 Dash': One person says a number (e.g., 37), and the other must quickly say its complement to 100 (e.g., 63). Keep a tally of correct answers to see who can get ten first.
- 'Hundred Snap': Using a standard deck of cards (Ace=1, 10=0, Jack/Queen/King removed, or use them as 10s for more complexity), lay two cards down. If their total is a complement to a 'tens number' that makes 100 (e.g., 3 and 7, which make 10, meaning the missing complement is 90), or if you say the number needed to get to 100 before the other person, you win the cards!

A little practice goes a long way in building math confidence!

Redwood Class - Mr Rogers

Redwood Class Bring Their Percy Jackson Characters to Life!

This week, Redwood Class stepped into the world of Greek mythology as they created their very own characters to fit into the Percy Jackson universe. From shadow creatures and fiery demigods to mystical warriors and magical heroes, the children used powerful descriptive writing to imagine beings that could stand beside Percy himself! After crafting their detailed character descriptions, the class used Al image generation to bring their creations to life. The excitement in the classroom was incredible as pupils watched their written ideas transform into stunning visual artworks. It was a fantastic way to celebrate creativity, descriptive language, and the magic of storytelling.
